This 12-month Nationally Recognised qualification reflects the role of counsellors, who work with clients on personal and psychological issues using established counselling modalities. They use communication, micro-counselling and interviewing skills – and draw on varied counselling therapies to assist clients. At this level, the counsellor would be working in defined and supported counselling roles in established agencies rather than in independent practice.

## What you will learn

You will learn skills and techniques which you can implement in a career that offers support to people from varied backgrounds in various areas – and enable you to make a difference in your community.

## How you will learn

Assessments are by way of written and oral assignments, supplemented with practical activities. You will be expected to complete practical activities through attending mobile workshops and in the workplace.

## Flexible, supportive, online learning

Learning is self-paced over a 12-month period, to best suit your individual needs and lifestyle. All your learning resources will be available online and your Trainer will assist, encourage and support you through your studies.



## Student entry requirements

TrainSmart Australia will assess a student's 'academic suitability' to ensure the student has the best chance of success. This is determined by either: The student providing TrainSmart Australia with a copy of an Australian Year 12 certificate; or, the student providing TrainSmart Australia with a copy of Certificate IV qualification (or above); or, the student completing the Core Skills Profile for Adults online assessment passing at or above Exit Level 3 in the Australian Core Skills Framework in both reading and numeracy.

## Academic Suitability

In addition to the entry requirements, the College will consider whether the student applying to enrol is academically suited to undertake the course, and demonstrates the capacity to meet the demands of their chosen course. Student academic suitability is determined through a one to one career counselling session where the student is invited to provide details of their previous work history and/or prior education relevant to the course. The student will be advised whether he or she is considered to be academically suited, or alternative study pathways may be offered.

VET Student Loan give rise to a HELP debt that continues to be a debt due to the Commonwealth until it is repaid and the VET Student Loan may attract a 20% Government loan fee.
